1350 SYSTEM PLANNING COMMITTEE

The System Planning Committee shall consist of at least three Trustees and the Director of Operations. One of the Trustees will serve as the Chairperson of the committee. The purpose of the System Planning Committee is to develop and maintain a long range strategic plan that:

- provides for quality property and facilities
 - considers major adjustments to programs and services
 - proactively responds to change in the missionary community and economic environment.

5250 CLASS/COURSE SIZE LIMITATIONS

Class/course sizes shall be maintained within the following limits:

<i>Class</i>	<i>Maximum Size</i>	<i>Minimum Size</i>
Kindergarten	20 students	8 students
First Grade	22 students	9 students
Second Grade	23 students	9 students
Third Grade	24 students	10 students
Fourth - Eighth Grade	25 students	10 students
Ninth - Twelfth Grade	25 students/section	10 students/section

In split grade level classrooms, Grades 1-8, classes shall be limited to a maximum of 20 students. In multi-level (three or more grade levels) classrooms, Grades 1-6, classes shall be limited to 12 students.

Kindergarten through grade 8 shall be limited to one section per grade level on each campus after August 2007. Elementary/middle school class size limits may be exceeded for the children of missionaries who enroll after class enrollment has been determined. The class size shall be brought back in line as soon as possible by normal attrition.

Enrollment for Taichung Grade Nine shall not exceed ~~40~~50 students. Enrollment for each grade in grades 10-12 shall include qualified students transferring within the system, and new missionary students. Other new students will not be admitted if the class enrollment exceeds 60 students.

High school class size for Advanced Placement Courses may drop below the minimum down to five students, providing that only one section is offered. Normally, a second section of a given high school course will not be scheduled until the maximum class/course size is exceeded.

Class/course size limitation exceptions may be granted by the Superintendent when facilities are inadequate to house a maximum sized class, when safety is a consideration, when other extenuating circumstances exist, and/or when special provisions have been made.

5400 STANDARDS OF CONDUCT (New Policy in School Section)

While on campus or at school-sponsored functions the following activities are prohibited:

- Profanity
- Sexual promiscuity Premarital, extra-marital, and homosexual forms of sexual conduct
- Possession or use of pornographic materials
- Promotion or involvement in the occult
- Promotion or use of excessive violence
- Possession, use, or promotion of unauthorized controlled substances, illegal drugs, tobacco products, or alcoholic beverages.
- Possession or use of potentially dangerous items including, but not limited to, fireworks, knives, guns, and martial arts weapons. The Campus Principal may grant exceptions for adult-supervised fireworks displays.

5430 SUBSTANCE ABUSE (School Section)

Use, abuse, being under the influence of, or being in possession of unauthorized drugs, narcotics, tobacco, alcohol, or other dangerous substances of any kind while on campus or at school-sponsored functions is a serious violation of school rules. Students who violate this regulation will be suspended from school. A conference between parents and administrators will be required as a condition for re-admission.

5440 POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS ITEMS (School Section)

While on campus or at school-sponsored functions, the possession and/or use of potentially dangerous items are restricted. This includes, but is not limited to, fireworks, knives, guns, and martial arts weapons.

PORNOGRAPHY RELATED POLICIES STAFF CODE OF CONDUCT

3020 CHRISTIAN BEHAVIOR AND PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

Morrison Academy is committed to the Word of God and its authority regarding all matters of Christian faith and living. Morrison Academy faculty, staff, administrators, and Trustees are expected to abide by the Biblical principles for conduct becoming of a Christian. Morrison Academy will maintain these principles, with an attempt to respect the various Christian denominational traditions.

Professional Ethics

Based upon the Scriptural principles of working as to the Lord, and with respect for all, the highest standards of ethics are to be maintained by the faculty, staff, administrators, and Trustees in working with students, their families, and colleagues. These standards include integrity, honesty, fairness, confidentiality, abstinence from abusive behavior, ~~abstinence from substance abuse~~, respect for individuals, and respect for racial and religious diversity.

The following activities are prohibited:

- profanity
- possession or use of pornographic materials
- promotion or involvement in the occult
- propagation of beliefs that conflict with the Morrison statement of faith
- promotion or use of excessive violence
- possession, use, or promotion of unauthorized controlled substances, illegal drugs, or tobacco products, or alcoholic beverages
- drunkenness, or the possession of alcohol within Morrison facilities with the exception of faculty housing

~~Morrison personnel are expected to carry out their responsibilities with competence and professionalism, and to abide by the established policies and procedures of the school.~~

Sexual Behavior Standards

Based upon the teaching of the Bible that marriage between husband and wife is a sacred institution, and sexual conduct is to be within the context of marriage alone, Morrison Academy believes abstinence from other sexual conduct to be required by Scripture.

Personnel are expected to abstain from ~~promiscuous~~, premarital, extra-marital, and homosexual forms of sexual conduct. Personnel are also expected to abstain from any form of harassment, including sexual harassment (See Policy 1650). Furthermore, the school holds to a standard that marriage is a covenant and that divorce should not be condoned. In the case of an employee who divorces or separates while employed by Morrison Academy, continuing employment will be considered on the basis of the circumstances of the divorce or separation.

Investigation and Discipline

When a violation of these principles is suspected, the Superintendent, at his discretion, may place the employee on a leave of absence. If an investigation confirms that a violation has taken place, the Superintendent may discipline the employee by placing a letter of reprimand in the employee's file, or other action deemed appropriate. In cases of a confirmed violation of a serious nature, the Superintendent, in consultation with the Board of Trustees and the employee's mission, may require counseling, probation, or the termination of employment.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

6440 STANDARDS OF CONDUCT (Boarding Division Section)

The Boarding Division reserves the right to determine the standards of conduct within which the boarding students are expected to live while they are under its authority and responsibility. The following activities are prohibited:

- ~~7. Possession, use, or promotion of unauthorized controlled substances, illegal drugs, tobacco products, or alcoholic beverages.~~

While under the jurisdiction of the Boarding Division, students may not attend dances.
